#### Mentor's Report

The Mentor Mentee Cell of the college has allotted me 51 mentees of B.A.I and B. A. II in the academic year 2023-2024. As per the policy of the Cell the mentees were guided during the interactions throughout the academic year.

Some students were contacted telephonically and some were interacted on campus throughout the year and guided for their academic progress. The meetings with the students were carried out in the academic year and discussed the overall development and academic progress. They were also guided in groups during their free time after the teaching schedule. They were given some sample question papers and ready-made notes to make them feel comfortable in facing the theory examination.

This system really has proven very helpful to understand the actual difficulties of the students. They were informed about many of the facilities and support services available in the college.

During my interactions with the mentees allotted to me, through telephonic talks and on campus discussions the following issues were raised by a few of them and those issues have been sorted out. The issues were as follows-
